PSF is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization founded in 2009 to educate the public about the serious risks created by the world's nuclear arsenal.

PSF was founded by an international group of prominent entrepreneurs from around the world to bring nuclear weapons issues to the forefront of the world's attention. Our board includes two private astronauts and each member shares a passion for space exploration and for securing our planet while at the same time exploring others. PSF believes that rockets are best used to explore space and to find other worlds, not as vehicles for devices that can end our own world with the push of a button.

There are few issues that pose a greater risk to civilization than nuclear weapons. Help us teach the world about the risks, encourage debate on the issues, and increase global awareness of the importance of eliminating nuclear weapons.

Job Description: Associate Director

The Associate Director position is an opportunity to take on an influential role in setting the strategy of the PSF and in building support for the organization as we pursue our goals. Reporting to the Executive Director and in close association with the Board of Directors, the Associate Director will be a key contributor to the foundation's educational, fund raising, and administrative activities. Responsibilities will include researching nuclear policy issues, planning and managing educational and fund raising events, developing relationships with partners, nuclear weapons experts, and potential donors, and hiring and managing PSF staff and interns. The Associate Director will also direct the foundation's communications and public relations efforts and will have frequent opportunities to publish analysis and position papers on behalf of PSF.

Full-time and Part-time applicants will be considered. Preferred location is the Washington DC metro area, but remote-working arrangements with frequent travel to DC will be considered.

Desired requirements include:

- Minimum of a four-year degree, advanced degree preferred
- Awareness of and interest in nuclear policy issues
- Experience in or knowledge of the aerospace and defense industry and/or international relations
- Demonstrated success at leadership of small teams
- Track record of outstanding achievements
- Excellent leadership, communication, presentation, organization, entrepreneurial and management skills
